






Philip Allnutt

Leigh is presently the Treasurer of the Port of Townsville Rotary Club and for the last 2 years has been one of the three Prison Chaplains from our congregation.


APPOINTMENT OF NEW DIOCESAN ACCOUNTANT



THE PASSION OF THE CHRIST

Thurs, Tues, Wed 10.30am, 6.45pm Fri, Sat, Sun, Mon 1.00pm, 6.45pm

A depiction of the last twelve hours in the life of Jesus of Nazareth, on the day of his crucifixion in Jerusalem. The story opens in the Garden of Olives where Jesus has gone to pray after the Last Supper. Betrayed by Judas Iscariot, the controversial Jesus--who has performed 'miracles' and has publicly announced that he is 'the Son of God'--is arrested and taken back within the city walls of Jerusalem. There, the leaders of the Pharisees confront him with accusations of blasphemy; subsequently, his trial results with the leaders condemning him to his death. Jesus is brought before Pontius Pilate, the prefect of the Roman province of Judaea, for his sentencing, Pilate listens to the accusations leveled at Jesus by the Pharisees. Realizing that his own decision will cause him to become embroiled in a political conflict, Pilate defers to King Herod in deciding the matter of how to persecute Jesus. However, Herod returns Jesus to Pilate who, in turn, gives the crowd a choice between which prisoner they would rather to see set free--Jesus, or Barrabas. The crowd chooses to have Barrabas set free. Thus, Jesus is handed over to the Roman soldiers and is brutally flagellated. Bloody and unrecognizable, he is brought back before Pilate who, once again, presents him to the thirsty crowd--assuming they will see that Jesus has been punished enough. The crowd, however, is not satisfied. Thus, Pilate washes his hands of the entire dilemma, ordering his men to do as the crowd wishes. Whipped and weakened, Jesus is presented with the cross and is ordered to carry it through the streets of Jerusalem, all the way up to Golgotha. There, more corporal cruelty takes place as Jesus is nailed to the cross--suffering, he hangs there, left to die. Initially, in his dazed suffering, Jesus is alarmed that he has been abandoned by God his father. He then beseeches God. At the moment of his death, nature itself over-turns.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and theologian known for his opposition to National Socialism. His ties to the July 20, 1944, conspiracy to overthrow the Nazi regime led to his execution in 1945. His theological writings are regarded as classics throughout the Christian world.

He was one of the earliest critics of the Nazi regime, Bonhoeffer became involved in the Confessing Church, a movement that fought against the nazification of the German Evangelical Church.

During the Nazi era, Bonhoeffer became an important contact for church and ecumenical leaders in the United States and Europe.

He was arrested in 1943 and executed in the Flossenbürg concentration camp in April 1945.




April 11th

George Selwyn

The archbishop of Canterbury, William Howley, consecrated George Selwyn, bishop of New Zealand on 17 October 1841 Selwyn arrived in Auckland, on 30 May 1842 aboard the brig *Bristolian*. Selwyn's prodigious energy and all-round accomplishments impressed both Māori (whose language he had begun to learn on the passage out) and settler. His first visitation tour took six months, covering about 2,300 miles, one third of which he walked, travelling the balance by ship, horseback, boat and canoe. He became a competent mariner, mastered the art of navigation, and in his small schooner, the *Undine*, undertook coastal passages in ill-charted waters, as well as ocean voyages to Melanesia.

Selwyn established his base at the Church Missionary Society station at the Bay of Islands.





Are you interested in deepening your awareness of God's action in your daily life?

There are many ways of doing this. One way was developed by Ignatius of Loyola who developed a series of exercises in prayer. He believed that much like physical exercise strengthens the body; spiritual exercises strengthen our souls. His focus was to help us deepen our awareness of God's action in our lives.

Among the fruits of the Exercises are:

- Discovering who I really am
- Directing myself toward God
- Noticing God's action in my life
- Responding to the movements of my heart
- Discovering the nature of my deepest desire
- Seeking God's will
- Becoming free of all that distracts me from my deepest desire
- Making choices in line with my truest self
- Connecting my lived experience with the life, death, and resurrection of Christ
- * Responding to God's love for me
- Finding God in all things

These exercises are very adaptable. Some people undertake several days or a few weeks of the exercises; others the full exercises in a 30-day retreat; while many undertake the full exercises in everyday life which takes about 9 months.


