







If you would like to spend about an hour exploring the cathedral, we are offering children's holiday activities on Tuesday mornings between 8.30 and 12.



# July 22<sup>nd</sup> - We welcome the Cathedral School of St Anne and St James for their Founders Day Service



- The Cathedral School of St Anne & St James began life in 1917 as a humble girls' school with seventy-one students. Originally called St Anne's Church of England Girls' School, the campus consisted of a single building in the middle of Townsville city where the City Council now stands.
- Over these past 100 years, the school has thrived. It has weathered the Great War, the Great Depression and a total evacuation during World War II; it found its way in new territory after outgrowing its campus and again after farewelling its beloved founding Sisters, and it has adapted fluidly to the changing tides in education and society.


Our Story - The Cathedral School





Our Cathedral window of St James is from 1907 and is dedicated in memory of the late Mr James Gordon, who was actively associated with the early history of Downsville, and especially with the beginning of church work in the city.

Our Cathedral bell tower supports a white stone statue of Saint James the Great, (affectionally known as "Slim Jim") which was erected in 1960 on the completion of the Cathedral. The sculptor was Erwin A. Guth who was born in Saarbrucken, Germany in 1926. He studied at the Berlin Academy of Fine arts during the Second World War (1940-42) and was a teacher of sculpture at the Ministry of Public Worship and Instruction of the Saar from 1950-1953 before migrating to Australia in 1954








#### The 1956 Torch

Start date: 2 November 1956, Olympia (Greece)

End date: 22 November 1956, Main Stadium, Melbourne (Australia)

First torchbearer: Dionyssios Papathanassopoulos

Last torchbearer: Ronald William "Ron" Clarke, Olympic participant in

athletics (1964, 1968), bronze medallist in Tokyo 1964.

**Number of torchbearers:** 3,181: 350 in Greece, 2,831 in Australia.

**Recruitment of torchbearers:** To qualify, the participants had to be able to run 1 mile (1.61 km) in 7.5 minutes. For the Organising Committee, one athlete from each sport had to participate. The relay was not open to women or professional sportsmen.

**Distance:** ~20,470km in total (air travel included): 4,912km by land, including

354km in Greece

**Countries visited:** Greece, Turkey, Iraq, Pakistan, India, Thailand, Singapore,

Indonesia, Australia

**Torch Details** 

**Description:** The torch was modelled on that of London 1948. The handle ends in a ring, and the upper part, in the shape of a cauldron, presents the Olympic rings three times. It bears the inscription: "XVI Olympiad 1956:

Olympia Melbourne".

Colour: Silver

Height: 47cm with burner, 40.5cm without


**Composition:** Metal, aluminium

Fuel: Hexamine in tablet form with additional naphthalene and a special

igniting material. The combustion duration is 15 minutes.

"Carrying the Torch 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games by Marcus Marsden







The torch weighed one point eight kilograms, and it felt very heavy after a mile held at arm's length. If the runners held it too close to their bodies, sparks blew in their faces.

- The convoy commander held a roving commission with the added duty of moving ahead when possible to towns where civic receptions were to be held, to finalize details and at the same time present commemorative medals to civic dignitaries in appreciation of the part they played in the organization of the Relay.
- For several weeks before the arrival of the flame, very heavy rain had fallen over most of the route, and in the northern section flooding was serious, roads and bridges being under water. The convoy was able to continue except over one river, where arrangements had to be made to carry the flame and vehicles by train over a higher bridge. This involved delay, as the trucks had to be loaded in pitch darkness, but the over-all loss of time, 65 minutes, was soon recovered.
- Shortly afterwards flooding caused a further setback, necessitating a long detour through uninhabitated country which added an extra 22 miles. As it was impossible to arrange for extra runners many volunteered to run twice, but despite this, and the very unpleasant conditions, the 257 miles of this stretch were run in exactly the time allowed for the original route of 235 miles. Civic receptions were planned in all major centres and times varying up to half an hour were allotted. The Organizers had to outline procedure and make arrangements for preserving the flame. In most cases, a special urn was built. Great welcomes awaited the flame along the entire route. In many towns, business ceased, everyone packing the main streets to attend the ceremonies and watch the flame go by. Day or night the enthusiasm remained.

Toc H is an international Christian movement. The name is an abbreviation for Talbot House, 'Toc' signifying the letter T in the signals spelling alphabet used by the British Army in World War I. A soldiers' rest and recreation centre named Talbot House was founded in December 1915 in Belgium. It aimed to promote Christianity and was named in memory of Gilbert Talbot, son of Edward Talbot, then Bishop of Winchester, who had been killed at Hooge in July 1915. The founders were Gilbert's brother Neville, then a senior army chaplain, and the Rev Philip Clayton. Talbot House was an "Every Man's Club", where all soldiers were welcome, regardless of rank. It was "an alternative for the 'debauched' recreational life of the town". [

The original building at Poperinghe, Belgium has been maintained and redeveloped as a museum. Branches of Toc H were established in many countries around the world. An Australian branch was formed in Victoria in 1925 by the Rev Herbert Hayes

Toc H members sought to ease the burdens of others through acts of service. They also promoted reconciliation and worked to bring disparate sections of society together.

The organisation suffered a progressive decline in membership and closure of branches during the later 20th century. In 2008, continued operation was ensured by dispensing with paid staff. In the 21st century, Toc H trustees have planned for it to become a stronger, voluntary movement still guided by the ethos of the original Talbot House.





This replica lantern (a symbol of <u>Toc H</u>) was donated to the Townsville Toc H Branch by Cecil E. Smith.

When the branch closed, the lantern was donated to the Cathedral by the Smith Family It is mounted on a plank from an original pew on which soldiers would have sat prior to being deployed
