Eliza Marsden Hassall (1834-1917)


In July 1880 she helped to found the New South Wales branch of the Young People's Scripture Union, of which she became secretary.

In July 1892 the Church Missionary Association of New South Wales was formed, reflecting unprecedented interest in evangelical missions. It set its own policies and recruited its own missionaries, although the parent committee retained ultimate control over their placement.

About 1893 Eliza bought Cluden, on the corner of Frederick and Church streets, Ashfield, close to the church of St John the Baptist. In response to a request from the C.M.A., here she established Marsden House (the Marsden Training Home for Women Missionaries). Its first recruit, her niece Amy Isabel Oxley, went to China in 1896.

The training home's curriculum comprised Bible studies and missionary geography. Eliza was voluntary superintendent and president of the ladies' fund-raising committee. In 1898 the home expanded into further leased premises and the following year held a successful missionary exhibition. Eliza was made an honorary life member of the Church Missionary Society, London. Almost three-quarters of Australian missionaries overseas in her time were women. She had contributed significantly to their recruitment in Sydney.

Epiphany- January 6th

The 12th day after Christmas is an important date in the Christian calendar as it is the day that remembers the Wise Men's visit to baby Jesus and the revelation of the Son of God to mankind. It is believed that the Epiphany was first celebrated in the fourth century.

The Wise Men brought symbolic gifts to the baby. Frankincense represented the divine birth. Gold was symbolic of Jesus' royal standing, and myrrh was for his mortality.



January 9th Baptism of our Lord

Jesus came to John the Baptist while he was baptising people in the River Jordan. ... As soon as Jesus was baptised, he came up out of the water. Heaven was opened and he saw the spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. Then a voice said from heaven, "This is my own dear son with whom I am pleased."

Church on Moa (St Paul's) circa 1934

Torres Strait Islanders refer to the arrival of London Missionary Society (LMS) missionaries in July 1871 as 'the Coming of the Light.' Reverend A W Murray and William Wyatt Gill were the first LMS missionaries to visit Moa Island in October 1872. South Sea Islander lay preachers were appointed as teachers to work on the island the following month. These teachers established a mission settlement at Totalai on the northern side of the island:







Michael was born into Church life. His father and grandfather being a priest and his mother the church organist.

Michael has been involved with the music of this cathedral for the last 33 years.

Michael moved to Townsville in 1989 and in 1990 was asked to assist with the building of a new organ. He worked with Frank Carroll and the organ builders. He assisted as organist at St James until 1994 when he took over as organ director.

Michael has done solo concerts in St James and has played Saint-Sean's organ Symphony with the RAR orchestra.

During his time as organist he has also been on parish council and Diocesan Council. He has been Chairman of Committees and on occasion acting Chancellor. At the same time Michael has been a barrister with a successful practice and not least husband and father.

Michael has made himself available for all the choirs and rehearsals over the years, be it for special services, or special concerts.

THE ORGAN GOES

Yes, the time has finally arrived for the organ to go which is just as well because the St James' Cathedral organ is barely going, musically, in its present condition.

The organ was farewelled at a opportunities for recitals, Saturday, 16th March, 1991, attended by approximately 200 people. Dismantling of the instrument has started and the component parts will be shipped to Sydney for restoration.

Art of Contemplative Practice 1 is a program delivered at The House of Prayer and Spirituality Townsville. The program is recognised by the University of Divinity and may earn credit towards other Graduate or Masters programs.

•Led by Marg Trevethan and Brianne Falconieri, participants will be guided though a program that explores the foundational principles of contemplation and their relevance to life, work and spiritual practice. The formation process will draw on the contemplative elements of inner silence, solitude, spiritual practices, listening, discernment and the human experience of transcendent. Participants will be invited to explore the impact on their developing awareness of these spiritual aspects and practices in their everyday life experience.

Upon successful completion of this unit, it is expected that students will be able to:

- •Demonstrate an informed and critical appreciation of contemplation.
- •Articulate an understanding of various experiences of contemplation.
- •Assess models of spiritual practice, listening and action that relate to everyday life experience.
- •Compare and contrast various approaches to contemplation practices as they relate to vocational engagement and systematically evaluate the traditional approaches to contemplative practice.
- •Creatively apply the principles of contemplative practices to discernment processes in life decisions.
