St James Anglican Church & Cemetery



As the only church in this colonial settlement, the Franklin Village Chapel, as it was then known, served the spiritual needs of the residents of the surrounding area including the boys from the Classical and Commercial School opposite. It also served as a village school. The site has been classified by the National Trust of Australia (Tasmania) and registered by the Tasmanian Heritage Council. It is one of the rare remaining elements of early Franklin Village.

Built on land donated by Mr Britton Jones, Franklin Village Chapel was officially opened on the 15th April 1845 by the first Bishop of Tasmania, Francis Nixon. The burial ground was consecrated on that occasion.

A school for village children operated in the building from 1847.

In 1926 the building was consecrated and renamed St James Church.







Rev Robert William Haines MOLINE (20 October 1889 – 8 August 1979)

- Robert joined the Brotherhood of St Barnabas in North Queensland and was its warden from 1925 to 1927.
- He was the Archdeacon of North Queensland until 1929
- He became <u>Archbishop of Perth</u>, a position he held until his retirement in 1962.
 He was consecrated a bishop on 25 April 1947, by <u>Geoffrey Fisher</u>, <u>Archbishop of Canterbury</u>, at <u>Westminster Abbey</u>.
