# February 2<sup>nd</sup> Presentation of our Lord at the Temple

# February 3<sup>rd</sup> First Anglican Service at Sydney Cove 1788

The First Fleet reached the country of the Gadigal people of the Eora Nation, on Saturday 26 January 1788. It was not possible to hold a service the following day, which was a Sunday.

On the following Sunday, the Governor Arthur Phillip, with about 1500 people, including civil servants, soldiers, marines and convicts, assembled on a ridge above what is now known as Sydney Cove for Divine Service. The service was conducted by the Chaplain, The Rev'd Richard Johnson, with the scripture text for the sermon- Psalm 116: 11-12: "How shall I repay the Lord for all his benefits to me? I will take up the cup of salvation and call upon the name of the Lord." We do not know what Johnson said, but following the conventions of the late eighteenth century, he probably spoke for about forty-five minutes.




# February 11<sup>th</sup> Transfiguration

Matt 17.1-9 Mark 9.2-9 Luke 9.28-36 1





# February 20<sup>th</sup> William Grant Broughton (1788-1853) First Bishop of Australia

He was the first (and only) <u>Bishop of Australia</u> of the <u>Church of England</u>.

Always concerned about the role of the church and its governance, in 1850 Broughton convened a conference of Australian bishops in Sydney, to consider the changing role of the colonial church and the arrangements under which it worked. The recommendations of this conference resulted in unrest and criticism locally from those concerned about the role of the laity in the governance of the church. In 1852 he proceeded to England to put his case and discuss the future of the church in the colonies. Arriving in London in ill health, he died on 20 February 1853 and was buried in Canterbury Cathedral


#### Cont.....

Heraldry is a system of creating symbols for the purpose of identification that has existed for many hundreds of years. The main element of heraldry is a coat of arms

The original Grant of Arms of Bishop Broughton in 1838, was four stars, the Crux Australia (or the Southern Cross without the fifth star), imposed on a blue field. The General Synod grant added the Cross of St George superimposed with a mitre.

The Cross of St George is the emblem of the Church of England and mitre denotes that it is episcopal led (Bishops). It was placed above the shield of all persons who were entitled to wear the mitre.

The fifth star of the Crux Australis is omitted —even the Lalor's Eureka Stockade flag had the Southern Cross without the fifth star.



### February 24<sup>th</sup> - Matthias

Acts reveals that Matthias accompanied Jesus and the Apostles from the time of the baptism of Jesus to the <u>Ascension</u> and that, when it became time to replace Judas, the Apostles cast lots between Matthias and another candidate, St. <u>Joseph</u> Barsabbas.

Soon after his election, Matthias received the <u>Holy Spirit</u> with the other Apostles (Acts 2:1–4). He is not mentioned again in the New Testament.



### February 27<sup>th</sup> George Herbert (1633)

George Herbert was a poet and Church of England clergyman. His poetry would influence many fellow poets

Herbert was one who exchanged the advantages of noble birth and worldly preferment for the strains of serving at "Gods Altar," one whose "obedience and conformitie to the Church and the discipline thereof was singularly remarkable," and whose "faithfull discharge" of the holy duties to which he was called "make him justly a companion to the primitive Saints, and a pattern or more for the age he lived in." This is not only high praise, but praise with political as well as religious implications: in 1633 the church was a place of contention as well as worship, and Ferrar helped establish Herbert as a model of harmonious, orderly, noncontroversial devotion for whom faith brought answers and commitment to the social establishment, not divisive questions and social fragmentation George Herbert | Poetry Foundation

# February

School Chaplaincy is a program that provides **pastoral and practical support** to students. More than 3000 schools across Australia choose to engage a school chaplain as a part of their student wellbeing team.

School chaplains are qualified youth workers who support young people in the schoolyard. They are positive role models who deliver compassionate pastoral and practical support to school communities. They promote social, emotional and spiritual wellbeing through role modelling, mentoring, pastoral care, structured activities and programs leading to social, emotional and spiritual support, wellbeing outcomes, and educational outcomes.

Chaplains are trained to a nationally recognised standard in how to recognise mental health issues, and how to ensure students with such issues connect with other care professionals, including psychologists. They have completed training to manage cyber-bullying, provided by the e-Safety Commission.

Chaplains are qualified to support students' religious and spiritual needs in a culturally sensitive and appropriate way


